I'm shy and bashful and reluctant sometimes to volunteer and I decided to stay for Sunday school and study the Bible which helps to understand things when discussed as a group.

I did not have any wow moments but felt small changes. Like I said I'm a work in progress. I've had a lot of people who have helped me along the way. My mom was my rock and gave me guidance and she did a lot of praying for me.

I have a lot of people who are encouraging and helpful and a living example of how I want to be.

I'm a long way from where God wants me to be but he's working on me to be a better version of myself.

God knows I need a lot of work but he's willing to work on me and help me on this journey. It's not easy but with God's help I'll get there.

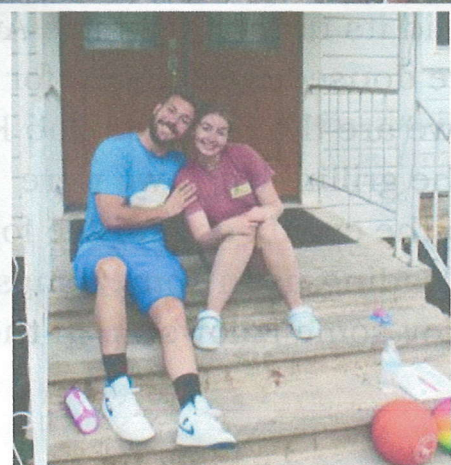
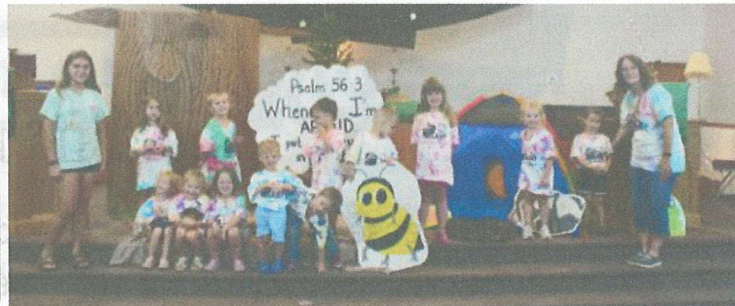
Pastor Vince, Ty, and Shayla lead games all 3 nights by playing kickball, duck duck goose, skipping, hopping, and several more fun games!

Thank you to everyone that helped make this year's VBS one to remember! Already looking forward to next year!

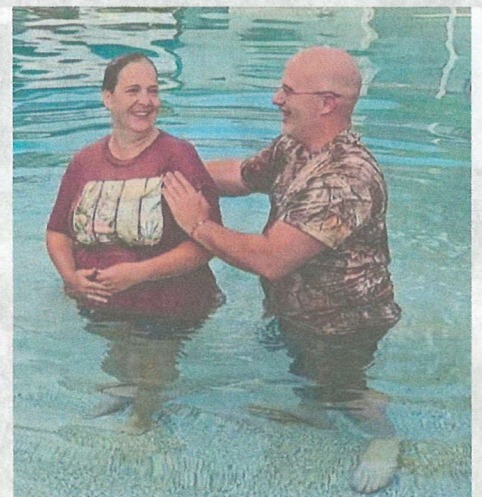

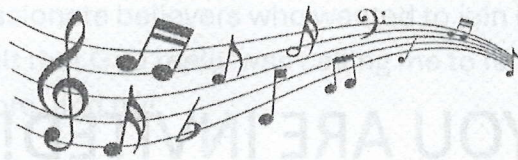
FUTURE MVP'S

Dear Paradise Family,

July 2026

This week I had the opportunity to tell a 30-year-old story to the Cru Military team to encourage them. I thought maybe I would tell it to you as well.

After I went on my first mission trip to Russia in 1995, I fell in love with missions and sharing the love, beauty, wisdom, power, and salvation of Jesus. Josh McDowell invited me to work with him and his team—and I was thrilled! But then they told me that I had to raise my support as a missionary to be a full-time Campus Crusade for Christ staff member, I was in shock. I had heard of missionaries raising support, *but to be one?* My heart sunk.

A team member from the Josh McDowell Ministry called me three times over the course of that year—each time answering my questions and encouraging me that if God really was calling me, He would help me raise my support from compassionate believers who wanted to join in on missions. After a year of praying, crying, and struggling, I felt that God really was calling me to raise funds to be a missionary. I was terrified, but I would trust, pray more, and try!

After talking to a few friends, they invited me to speak at their churches. I was shaking in front of crowds. I did my best to talk about the mission work I was going to do with orphans and other people in need around the world—and how I wanted to tell them about Jesus. I was 25 years old, wandering around Pennsylvania, shaking, and asking people to join me in missions as a partner. I was Bambi on ice, but I prayed and plunged forward.

God taught me so much in that journey about pride, faith, the Body of Christ, money, forgiveness, grace, faithfulness, gratitude and more. After a year and a half, I was fully supplied by 5 churches and 105 partners and ready to move to Dallas, Texas, to start work with the Josh McDowell Ministry.

I have been working with ministry partners and raising support for 30 years now. I have had some very, very lean times where I was hurting badly—and the thought of quitting crossed my mind. But God was always kind to show me a new lesson, a new aspect of His Heart, and He always provided new help to find new partners and rise again. And some of my partners have been with me for 30 years!

The Apostle Paul talking to his supporters about his financial situation (in Philippians 4:10-14) has always been so meaningful for me:

How I praise the Lord that you are concerned about me again. I know you have always been concerned for me, but you didn't have the chance to help me. Not that I was ever in need, for I have learned how to be content with whatever I have. I know how to live on almost nothing or with everything. I have learned the secret of living in every situation, whether it is with a full stomach or empty, with plenty or little. For I can do everything through Christ, who gives me strength. Even so, you have done well to share with me in my present difficulty.

Here is where I get stuck in my letter. I want to tell you how much my partners have meant to me over the years—how much YOU have meant to me! I can't find enough words—or the right words. The emotions are there—the words are not.

And I get stuck trying to communicate all the precious people over these 30 years that we have helped **together**—encouraged, fed, clothed, gave Bibles and other books, shared Christ, showed God's love in ways they needed it the most. I cannot remember them all myself, but Jesus knows each and every person! He loves them with such a Great Love (Ephesians 2:4)!

Thank you! And my prayer for YOU is that God will bless you for your part in this mission. Lately I just love to pray through God's Word. I am praying these promises over you:

*"A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will **be refreshed**." – Proverbs 11:25*

*"Give, and it will be given to you. **A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap.**" – Luke 6:38*

I moved on from The Josh McDowell Ministry to Unto, and now to Cru Military. The military community is such a special people-group, and I believe they need Jesus more now than ever before. With wars and rumors of wars, I see the emotional toll it takes on these amazing men and women. Thank you for helping me to reach them with some amazing Good News! Jesus will never leave or forsake them. He will empower and guide them! Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life!

That's my God story from fear to faith and to some pretty crazy stories after that.

What is your God story? Look back—how has God led you over these last years? Where is He leading you to? *Please...tell me YOUR story!*

Dear Partners in Ministry!

I leave September 3 for the first-ever MonGOLia mission trip with Cru Military and the Centurions. I am so excited! (I am writing early since I have so much to do before then!)

When the Mongolian Team originally asked me to help design a mobility mission trip to the military for them, the original request was just to meet the needs of children. One division of the military asked if we could see some injured veterans. So we are now ministering to veterans, too. In fact, the need for wheelchairs for veterans is so great, we may be seeing 50% children and 50% veterans.

Why wheelchairs? Being in the Mongolian military is not a high-paying job. Most families cannot afford a wheelchair for their handicapped children. So, they carry them from place to place, or they stay home because it is easier. With a wheelchair, they can be free to go to more places as a family.

How will they hear the gospel? After the event, the Centurions missionaries will be visiting the children and their families in their homes to see how they are doing, to make sure the wheelchairs are functioning properly, to build relationships, and to answer any questions they have. In the home setting, there is more freedom to talk about faith in Jesus.

But wait...there might be more! The Centurions missionaries have plans for other ministry we can do if we have time. We may visit local hospitals, meet with families, join Bible studies, minister to officers and cadets, meet with military wives, and possibly even repair mobility aids for other people.

In a country less than 2% Christian, the missionaries there know they have a great task to make sure everyone has the chance to know and follow Jesus. The Centurions are focusing on the military community of 50,000 active-duty men and women and their families—a closed society hard to access. **Please pray for a revival in Mongolian in the military community!** Thank you so much for being a part of this mission to Mongolia!
