

Annette gave consistory an update on the Operation Christmas Child. She has 50 boxes available to be filled with additional at a cost of \$35/50 boxes. The boxes will be distributed Oct 5 and due back Nov 16. The \$10 shipping charge will be paid by the Church unless you want your package tracked. Bob and Annette will deliver the boxes to DuBois on November 17th.

The secretary's report was read and approved with a motion from Dean, seconded by Bob.

The Treasurer's report was reviewed and approved with a motion by Bob and a second from Brooke. The Thanksgiving fund still has \$100 in it which will be moved to the current fund.

The pastor search has had a small set back with two pastoral candidates rescinding their interest due to personal reasons.

Properties Committee

Danny Muth has the pipe completed. It didn't come to the bottom drain because he ran into more gravel. The final cost came in a bit higher than the estimate of \$4500 at a cost of \$5500 but will be good for many years now.

Andy Genevero has serviced the youth center furnace and deems it to be in great shape. "An old girl, but good". The furnace received a 72 on the efficiency test with brand new sometimes not scoring over 85. He did a very thorough overall and treated the tank. The fuel looks good. He is guesstimating it to be a 1,000-gallon tank.

A W-9 form is needed if work is done because if we pay more than \$600 a 1099 is required.

The fire extinguisher is not inspected. Brenda will contact them.

September 17 @ 6:30 the properties committee will meet to address the door, and chimney. Bobbi is requesting a light for her Sunday School Class cubby.

Prizes were awarded to all the game winners and drawings were held for the remaining prizes, with everyone receiving at least one prize for the evening.


Thank you to everyone who attended, brought food/drinks and donated gifts. A special thank you to the ladies who presented readings and hosted the games.
