President Diane Carlson opened the meeting with prayer.

Those in attendance were Brenda Weber, Bob Roy, Dean Reed, Diane Carlson, Holli Polito, Bobbi Becker, Annette Roy, Linda Pifer, Debbie Pifer, Wendy Perry, Erica States, and Brooke Limrick.

The Secretary's report was read and approved by a motion from Bobbi, and a second by Bob.

The treasurer's report was reviewed and approved by a motion from Wendy, and a second by Dean.

The Search Committee was present to update the consistory on the pastor search. Our listing is now live with Chemistry Staffing. Research is being done and three pastors were surveyed to ascertain what combination of degree and experience we should require in a candidate. The profile currently requests a masters degree plus ordained, but may be tweaked pending more discussion.

A profile was received from a candidate thru the mail. They will be directed to contact Chemistry Staffing and follow the appropriate channels to resubmit thru them.

Brenda received a letter from St John's Church seeking help in getting the word out that they, too, are looking for a pastor and were interested in potentially sharing a pastor with us. Brenda will let them know that we are unable to commit to sharing a pastor, and direct them toward Chemistry Staffing for potential help in their search. There is now a link on our website directing potential pastors to Chemistry Staffing to streamline the vetting process.

Properties Committee

Dean gave an update on the chairlift project. Penn Highlands Medical has come back with a \$14,790 estimate for the chairlift plus installation. They also noted that since it would be in a commercial setting it would need inspected every year. He is still waiting on two additional estimates.

Lane and Dean believe the side door can still be repaired with a good cleaning and painting. There is minimal surface rust.

The parking lot drain project is in the works. We were assessed a \$125 fee (good for one year) for the call before you dig service due to our business status.

There will be a clean up day in May. More details to come.

The septic lids need marked. We're parking on top of them on the left side of the lower drive and there's concern that they'll crack.

The soffit between the old and new section needs replaced.

The committee is looking into how to track attendance to be able to reach out so no one falls thru the cracks.

The Pifer Family Fundraiser Event



He stirred individuals, families, groups and businesses to provide a tremendous amount of baskets and gifts and prizes for the raffle.


He sent willing, happy volunteers to bake 500 cornmeal muffins and offer to make lots and lots of desserts.


He was present with the men that showed up to spend their Saturday afternoon setting up and deep frying over 1000 pieces of fish and He enabled them to do a fabulous job.
